KEY MEETING OUTCOMES

- 1. New HDWG members agreed to develop a first draft of the conclusion chapter of the I-ADApT Synthesis book (Societal and governing responses to global change in marine systems).
- 2. Mini-typology meeting planned for July
- 3. I-ADApT to go on-line!! Two domain names purchased to host I-ADApT website
- 4. Decision to develop 2 proposals, one to the Sumitamato Foundation (Japan) and a larger multiyear proposal (the BIG proposal) possible to SSHRC (Canada), NSF or other.
